Just to confirm that we are hosting the planned mini steam meet for members of the Gauteng clubs on Friday 3 September and Saturday 4 September.

We will advise of any other attendance restrictions if the Lockdown Regulations on gatherings still limit us to 100 persons inside the fenced area. (These would be restricting attendees to immediate family only).

This is an informal gathering, and we will only provide tea/coffee and braai fires.

Participants are asked to do their own catering and bring their own steam oil.

Our standard Safety Rules apply.

Steam meet attendees are welcome to run at our normal Club Day on Sunday 5 September. This is open to the public and we run passenger hauling.

Lockdown restrictions have eased, so we started to open and run parties adhering to the Covid regulations. Thanks to our regular drivers that hauled steam as well.
