Chairman's notes

As you will see from photos, we experienced the worst flood ever at the club premises only a week after our new caretaker Swannie moved in. Water levels were close to half a meter higher than ever before. We flooded Sunday night 8th of December, and the water only cleared Tuesday afternoon. Due to the time everything was flooded, lots of mud and rubble was washed in.

A massive effort was needed to salvage our assets, clean the buildings and prevent further damage. Efforts started on Wednesday to clean away the mud in the buildings, and it took nearly a week to clean and lubricate all the locomotives and rolling stock. We suffered damage to basically everything, even the main compressor and all our tools. We also lost power for a few days. We suffered damage to most of the electrical equipment that was submerged, electric locos, gate motors, electrical tools and switchgear.

Thanks to all the members that came to assist with the cleanup, bringing generators, washers and extra labour as well as financial assistance. We received thousands of bags from Plastics SA, and also for the council removing the collected rubble. We also had assistance from members of the public, really appreciated. We managed to clean the station area, buildings and steaming bay, and recover most of the washed in rubble in these areas. We still need to do a lot of maintenance to our equipment, clean the rubble from the outer areas, and repair and lubricate the still stripped equipment. The priority was to get everything open and dried out to prevent further damage. We still need to do a lot of cleanup; we are not out of the mud yet.

We need to prioritise the new storage and raising of the existing bunkers. We do not have the resources to do it at the pace that we want, so all assistance and contributions will be appreciated. Please discuss any possibilities with the committee, from building materials to assistance with the construction. Our locos, rolling stock, tools and library cannot survive repeated events like these.
