Chairman's comments.

At the time of writing the second Covid wave peak was over with some of the level 3 restrictions being eased.

Despite the limited operations, public attendance was poor, mainly because of the rainy weather. We are still not back to normal operations and are not in a position where we build reserves. We have limited labour expenses, and only do critical maintenance.

All help surviving this period will be appreciated. Although we can store our locomotives in the new storage, we still must complete the access track to make access easier.

A few members came and enjoyed the facilities and steamed up during the month, let us keep our club and hobby alive.

We still looking forward to hearing and see member projects, please share some photos and progress with our editor.

Some progress on the riding cars:

We have at least 8 operating locomotives, and only 2 riding cars. Most drivers never had the opportunity to join the circus in their younger years, so driving with knees past the ears when we use passenger stock as driving cars makes one do this to you. I used the lockdown period to do some machining and preparing parts for additional riding cars. Most parts will be ready when we can start working again. Please join us when we schedule working on them, as no tools are required, only willing hands for assembly and painting.

Feedback on Lizzy.

Our only steam locomotive Lizzy saw some serious use over the last few months, with quite a few members becoming avid steam drivers It resulted in a few loose nuts on the valves, and a few recovery incidents. We repaired some valve gear components, tightened the offending nuts, and replaced the oil lubrication on the rear axle boxes with grease after we had a seize on the right rear axle box. We will see how reliable this arrangement is. Next step is needle roller bearings.

We also fitted a CSME nameplate and a builder's plate for Alan Pletschke that built it. It is an excellent loco, built by a master modeler. **Leon**

Track and grounds

Each month Swannie and his workers are just about able to keep up with the accelerated growth around the premises and are maintaining the site in a pleasant and neat state.

Work has been done to integrate the new line from the new storage at the station end. Work is progressing to underpin and stabilise the new tracks from the east end of the new storage to the station.



Bill Williams and CMBC have been involved with the **Hennops river revival group** to clear the ponds of water hyacinth which was taking over the east lake. Before and after below.



The attached pictures show what Tarryn Johnson & her colleague Tay of "Hennops Revival", who yesterday with their team cleared approx. 10 tons of hyacinth from the large pond, a remarkable feat of which 3 members of the Boat Club proudly assisted.

A call put out to the community for assistance in removing the accumulation removed from the water was answered by "Tyre Mart" a super gesture on their part to assist the community of Centurion.

Some of the hyacinth had grown to half a metre in height, as shown above by Tarryn. This obnoxious weed is well established in our environment and will continue to be a problem, doubling its presence about every 10 days, if the current amount of weed can be removed it could be eradicated considering that there is no more water flowing in from the Centurion Lake.

Tuesday and Saturday Gangs

Site maintenance machinery is the first priority each Tuesday with something always requiring maintenance and repair. Battery chargers for the electric locos have been re installed in the new storage. The alarm system control has been relocated to its new home from the old tunnels. And a mobile blower has been built, mainly from equipment lying around, for the track cleaning, to be pushed ahead of the motive power prior to each track usage.
