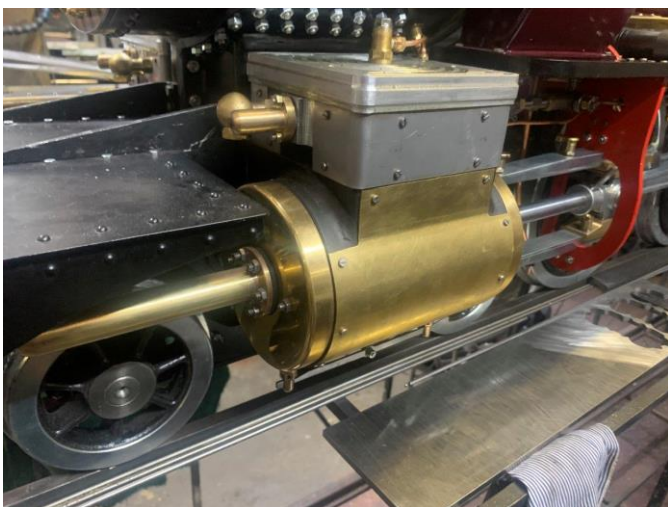

The Class 5 SAR loco is looking beautiful can't wait to see it perform! well done! Leon.

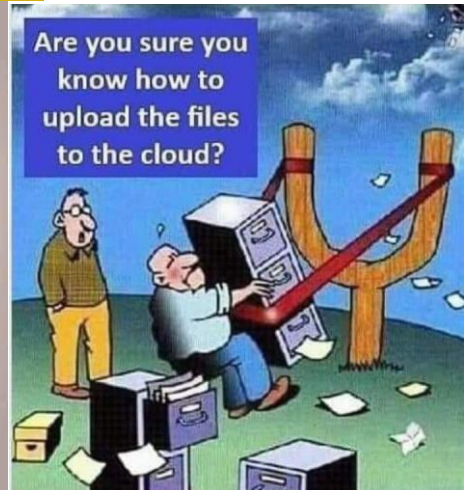

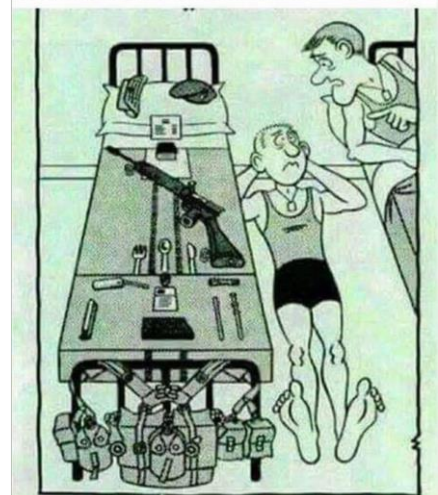
