Your roving editor visited MOTAT (museum of technology and transport) in Auckland and this kept all the family interested and occupied for most of the day. We started off by travelling from the car park to the main museum site by tram. The first thing I noticed was dual gauge track. This is because they have preserved trams from Wellington as well as other cities. The main track was 4' 8½" and wellington gauge was 4' due to narrow streets. The editor has more information and photos than can be published here.

Also, at MOTAT they have a large aircraft collection including Harvard, Spitfire and Sunderland. One of the smaller aircraft was a gyro copter. I had expected a good

motor car collection but only fire engines and the odd motor vehicle. The railway there was NZ standard 3'6" and the operating loco was an Avonside tank.
