The very original club was started way back in 1961. It was then called "Pretoria Live Steam Club/Pretoria Stoomtrekkragklub". In March 1985 the then Verwoerdburg Town Council made a piece of land available for the building of a "proper" track and facilities. The Council undertook the erection of the buildings and all the major earthworks, including the creation of three lakes. It was up to the members to lay the required tracks. This commenced in April 1991 and was completed by January 1992. Eventually, the whole plot was coming together, and the club could announce its official opening of the site on 12 June 1993.

We now have three affiliated groups, the boat club, the G-scale enthusiasts, and the Centurion Mini Truckers on site. These groups all add to the general entertainment of the public and give those members a permanent site to play.

It is important to remember that the main function of the CSME is still to provide members with a safe and attractive area to run their trains. The business side has become a necessity to provide and maintain the facilities. More and more we find that the Municipal Council cannot fulfil their obligations and it is up to the society to do the necessary.




