### Monday Gang

The bridge main structure is finished and being painted, the chequer plate for the platform base has been finished. The hand rails must be fitted. Steel rail sleepers have been made and are being fitted. Then rail sections must be made and connected to the track on either side of the bridge and track concreting completed. The landscaping around the new extension has been started and a TLB is required to shift large amounts of rock and soil.

Safety railings still have to be fitted to the sides of the concrete culvert. A large amount of work must be done to landscaping around the new extension.

## An update on the note from our vice chairman

Eureka! The Dennis missing parts have turned up in a safe place – so safe we could not remember! Dennis refurbishment can go ahead as soon as the refurbished wheel sets arrive.

Thomas has had the hydraulic gearbox serviced and refitted by John O'Mahoney so that should be back in service.

Barry is a little worn thin in the flanges so is currently used as backup until the other two are back on track. So, really this only leaves N0 7 for passenger hauling on non-club days.

#### Centurion Society Track Standards.

CSME have not in the past published track standards and certain of the features of the new track extension require certain limitations so the track standards below are being considered. If any member has any comments on this please contact the committee in writing without delay as absence of any comment will be taken as approval and considered by the committee for ratification at the July committee meeting.

CSME track is based on British Model Railway Wheel and Track Standards as suggested by Martin Evans and published in Model Engineering literature such as the Model Engineers Handbook. This is similar to the society for Model and Experimental Engineers (SMME) standards.

The track has the 3 common model Engineering gauges of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  inch (89mm), 5inch (127mm) and  $7\frac{1}{4}$  inch (184mm) on both the short inner and outer original track. The outer track extension only caters for 5" and  $7\frac{1}{4}$  " locomotives. Summary of the SMME track standards and wheel profiles required for running at CSME:
